- 1. Full admission to the SXU School of Education (& permission to enroll in Level 2 professional education coursework) requires 2 critical pieces of evidence - a Cumulative GPA of 3.0 AND passing the Illinois Basic Skills Requirement. Level 2 courses in the Elementary Education Program begin with the Junior I semester cohort schedule.*
- 2. Admission to Level 3 coursework requires evidence of passing the Illinois Licensure Testing System - Elementary Education (Grades 1–6) (197–200).*
- 3. Obtaining a Professional Educators License in Illinois requires the successful completion of the edTPA performance assessment. This assessment must be completed during the student teaching semester.*
